#### **SOAR Study Skills** For girls entering grades 6–8

Cost: \$350

Using the research-based study skills program called SOAR, students will participate in activities to cultivate the areas of the SOAR curriculum including Setting goals, Organizing, Asking questions, and Recording progress. SOAR Study Skills binder that will automatically set participants up for a more organized and successful school year. This camp is perfect for any student who struggles with organization, who has ADHD, learning difficulties, executive functioning difficulties, or who just needs to start this school year off better. Participants will come away empowered and ready to take on their new school year with new competencies and confidence! Materials will be provided.

Our guidance counselors, with the help of admissions specialists, will prepare students for college applications, interview, and essay components. Students will create their Common Application account and will be advised on its

process. Students will develop a master schedule for their intended schools, which will include important due dates, required submissions, standardized test policies, financial aid deadlines, and on-campus opportunities. Registration will close on July 12.


#### **G.O.A.L.** — **Go Out And Lead** For girls entering grades 5–7

June 28 to July 2, 9 am to 1 pm Cost: \$300

#### **ARTS CAMPS**

Portfolio-Building for Young Artists For girls entering grades 7–9

July 6 to July 15, 1 pm to 4 pm

Cost: \$350

This two-week program introduces young artists to the Elements of Art and Principles of Design. Students will use these visual tools in creating their own works of art. Working from observation and imagination, students will develop critical thinking skills as they study still life drawing & painting, printmaking, and collage. An emphasis will be placed on portfolio building,

and student work will be individually reviewed. The course will culminate with each student preparing their pieces for a portfolio presentation of their best works on the last day of class. Students applying for high school art scholarships will benefit greatly from this course. Each student will leave with a portfolio to continue building in the future. Portfolios will be provided.

# summer GUIDELINES AND @VILLa PRECAUTIONS

The health and safety of our students and staff is our top priority. We will adhere to the following guidelines listed below in order to have the most successful and healthy camp experiences. We appreciate your anticipated understanding.

- · All student belongings should be brought in one backpack-style bag.
- Class sizes will be limited, so that desks can be spaced out at least 6 feet apart, all facing in one direction.
- There will be daily temperature checks upon entering the building, utilizing no touch forehead thermometers.
- Rooms/restrooms and high traffic items (doorknobs, light switches, desks) will be cleaned daily.
- Sanitizer, gloves, and extra masks will be available in each classroom.
- If needed for camp, supplies for the white board (markers and erasers) will be provided to each individual student.
- Group snack breaks will not be permitted. Students are encouraged to bring their own water and snack.
- Electronic devices will not be shared.

- Masks must be worn at all times.
- Summer classes and additional camps that are running simultaneously will be in separate locations of the school to minimize interaction among all individuals in the building. We will utilize the Main Building, St. Joseph's Wing, and Maria Hall.
- Students will be given a specific entrance in order to enter the school. If you arrive earlier than 15 minutes prior to the camp's start time, you will be asked to wait in your vehicle.
- Throughout the course, if your daughter should feel ill at any time, we ask that she stay home.
- We will update these guidelines in accordance with current CDC recommendations at the time of each camp.
